

# Technology-enhanced Learning - Activity Plan

**TYPE** lesson plan

**LEVEL** Tertiary

**MODALITY** Blended

**SUBJECT** English Literature

**TECHNOLOGY** Internet Resource - Social Media - Video

**Name:** *Graham Stewart*

**Grade / Course:** *English for the Arts 101*

**Length of Activity:** *50 minute face-to-face session. Equivalent self-study time in groups to create blogs.*

## **Lesson Summary:**

Students to explore the UNESCO “World City of Literature” site, noting Durban’s recent induction, and then construct their own “Guide to Durban Writers” blogs listing people, events, books, resources.

## **Lesson Objective:**

To equip students with skills to (a) discover Internet resources on local writers and (b) how to select and share these links online with others.

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### **Intended Learning Outcomes**

- Students will learn about local writers and the place of literature in recognising, understanding and celebrating diverse local cultures.
- Students will learn about the UNESCO Cities of Literature programme.
- Students will learn how to share information online about literary people and events in their own city.

### **Instructional Activities**

The lecturer introduces the subject of Durban's selection as a UNESCO World City of Literature, using an interactive whiteboard to present a brief history of the selection process and the potential benefits of reading local writing and undertaking your own writing. (10 minutes)

The lecturer will explore key resource sites, indicating points of departure for student group Blogs. In groups, students will plan their Blogs and find at least one new link related to their chosen writer and upload it to their Blog, (40 minutes)

Homework follow-up - complete and publish blogs.

### **Learner Assessment**

Group completion of Writer's Blog with the minimum content as indicated below: Each group will create a blog including a short introduction to a writer or event, providing links to at least 3 online resources (biography, open licence publications, videos). Each link will include a short evaluative summary of the resource, indicating its value to students looking for advice on writing their own stories.
